
THE WORD IN LITURGY

The story of Noah sees in human sinfulness the corruption of the whole of creation, of which people are a part. God's judgement therefore comes upon everyone and everything. Like the forty days of Lent, forty days of deluge are required to purify the earth. This is strong medicine. The flood is a terrifying and cataclysmic disaster, signifying not only divine punishment through water (seen elsewhere in the Hebrew scriptures, for example, in the destruction of Pharaoh's army in Deuteronomy 11:14), but also an unleashing of the restraints place upon the waters in creation, and a return to primordial chaos.

The penitential psalm, Psalm 51, is attributed to David after he repented of his adulterous and murderous acquisition of Bathsheba as his wife. The psalm displays full consciousness both of the depth of sin and the power of the compassion of God to redeem from sin those who have fallen.

Today's passage presents Noah's salvation through the flood as a "type" for baptism, a radical means of purification, an awesome work of God resulting in a new creation and an everlasting covenant. Lent is indeed a God-given time, a season of grace.

ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK 2024 LENTEN REGULATIONS

The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily in His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, and **two** (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.

Those between the age of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast. On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially", or as a whole, is a serious obligation.

The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.

The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the <u>First Sunday of Lent</u>, <u>February 18, 2024 to</u> The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, May 26, 2024.

*Canon 920, §1. All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.


