CATHOLIC DOCTRINE

The Four Marks of the Church

The feast we celebrate today observes the anniversary of the dedication of the cathedral church of Rome, dedicated to St. John the Baptist, and later became known as St. John of the Lateran. Because it is the cathedral church of the bishop of Rome, the feast, at first observed only in Rome, was later extended to the whole Church as a sign of devotion to and of unity with the Chair of Peter. Thus this feast truly celebrates the universal Church which is apostolic, catholic, holy and one.

We believe the Church is apostolic because it is founded upon the apostles, those chosen witnesses who were sent out on mission by the Lord himself and who later testified to the saving plan of God in Christ (CCC 857). Through the agency of the Holy Spirit the Church is entrusted to keep and to hand on the teaching of the apostles.

We believe the Church is catholic or universal because Christ is its head. The body, the Church, is in union with its head who has provided "the fullness of the means of salvation" to us. This fullness of the means of salvation is to be found in a correct and complete confession of faith, sacramental life and ordained ministry in apostolic succession (CCC 830). The Church is also catholic in the sense that its mission is to the whole world.

We believe the Church is holy because Jesus, the Son of God, with the Father and the Spirit, is acknowledged as the Holy One and loved the Church so much that he sacrificed himself in order to sanctify his ecclesial body (CCC 823). Thus the Church is called the "holy people of God" and her members "saints". This holiness with which the earthly Church is endowed is real but also imperfect. Every individual within the Church, including ordained ministers, acknowledge that they are sinners.

We believe the Church is one because of its source, the divinity, who is the supreme example of unity: the God who is three-in-one (CCC 813). The Second Vatican Council, in different documents, also asserts that the Church is one because of its founder, Jesus, the Word made flesh, who by his saving action restores unity in "one people and one body" (GS, 78) and that the Church is one because of the Holy Spirit, "the principle of the Church's unity." (UR, 2)

These four characteristics, which we profess in the Creed, indicate essential elements or qualities of the Church and its mission. In and of itself, the Church does not possess these elements. They are gifts given by Christ, and simultaneously, a challenge. For the Church is called to realize, appropriate and work with this endowment.

Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini (November 13)

Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini became a saint by dedicating her life completely to Jesus Christ. She was the first canonized saint from the United States. As a Catholic sister, she immigrated from Italy and founded almost 70 institutions worldwide.

These facilities included orphanages, hospitals, and schools for the poor, abandoned, and marginalized.
