THE WORD IN LITURGY

The story of Job is an extraordinary literary and theological treatment of the theme of innocent human suffering. The Book of Job begins with a question raised in heaven, and answered on earth: whether God's faithful are only so because of the blessings they receive, or will they remain faithful even if God's benefits are withdrawn from them.

When the prosperous and just Job is suddenly afflicted by the death of his children, the loss of his wealth, and personal illness, a series of "friends" argue that his misfortunes must be punishment for some sin. Today's passage represents his response to one of these friends, rejecting such shallow theologizing in the face of his misery. The passage connects Job's personal lament with all innocent human suffering. Job's plight is not unique to him, but resonates in countless lives as a deep mystery that cannot be easily explained.

The psalm today responds with a witness to God's compassion for the downtrodden, and with praise for the greatness of God. Not content to leave us with Job's eloquent despair, the liturgy reminds us, through the psalm, of themes that come to the fore at the conclusion of the Book of Job: God's inscrutable ways, and the majesty present in all creation.

The emperor Constantine abolished it as a form of execution in the fourth century because of his pro-Christian stance. This would explain why crosses and crucifixes were not generally accepted as a type of Christian artwork until about the fifth century. The two earliest known representations date from about 430, a panel from the doors of Saint Sabina Church in Rome and a small ivory relief now found in the British Museum (OxA&A 126). The cross attributed to St. Francis (d. 1226) is a flat panel upon which is painted a figure of the dying Christ whose twisted body is help up by angels and surrounded by figures representing his mother, the disciple John, and others. Above the head of Jesus—on the top vertical end of the cross—is depicted the saints above whom can be seen the hand of God the Father outstretched in blessing over the Son. It is a vivid reminder of our Catholic belief in the redemptive aspect of Christ's suffering and death. ©FiF RCL |

ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK 2024 LENTEN REGULATIONS

The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily in His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, and **two** (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.

Those between the age of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.

On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially", or as a whole, is a serious obligation.

The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.

The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the **First Sunday of Lent**, **February 18**, **2024** to **The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity**, **May 26**, **2024**.

*Canon 920, §1. All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.
